Workshop on Policies to Promote Energy Efficiency in Transport

APEC Energy Ministers have identified fuel-efficient transport as a key strategy for limiting reliance on oil. How can APEC economies use the experiences they have accumulated to further their collective success in the realm of transportation energy efficiency? Reducing energy consumption while maintaining robust and effective transportation systems will require policies that make use of both vehicle efficiency and efficiency in the larger transport system.

The APEC economies have a vast collection of policies that are working toward the goal of energy efficient transportation systems, many of which were profiled in a recent report produced for APEC by the Alliance to Save Energy. The report aimed to present best practices and lessons learned from these policies, for the benefit of planning in other APEC economies. The workshop will build on the report by gathering further case studies and by bringing together experts and policymakers to discuss which policies could be effective for a wide range of APEC economies.

Workshop Venue and Organization

The workshop will take place on 24 and 25 March 2009, at the offices of the APEC Secretariat in Singapore. It will follow two concurrent tracks, one focused on the efficiency of vehicles for road transport, the other efficient transport systems. The workshop is designed to be a forum where substantive suggestions will be made on the applicability of various policies to a broad range of economies, so the attendees as well as the speakers should be prepared to participate actively in the proceedings. To that end, attendees ideally will have broad or deep expertise in policy regarding a relevant subject area (see agenda). We invite transportation planners, energy experts, automobile manufacturers and policy-makers to participate in the workshop.
